
## SCREECE at THE REACT DPaw a Crow/Raven

Use the steps below to draw your bird. Refer to photographs to make your bird look more like a crow or a raven. Crows have beaks that are more triangular, while ravens have a more robust and curved beak. Ravens also tend to be scruffier around the bill and neck



Ravens are one of the smartest animals, often considered smarter than many mammals, and possess problem solving skills that are similar to a 5 yr. old human.



Ravens and crows can recognize people's faces, and they can talk to each other just like you do— using raven and crow sounds, of course.

Ravens are larger than crows, with wingspans of 3-4 feet, compared with a crow's wingspan of closer to 2 feet. Ravens are more often found alone or in pairs in rural and wilderness areas, while crows are more often found in groups in urban areas.
